CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS GYMNASTICS


As a result of their successes in the Zone Competitions, the following students were selected to represent the Zone in the Champion of Champions Tournament.

STUDENT, PARENT/CAREGIVER, TEACHER CONFERENCES

Over the last decade as the purpose of classroom assessment has changed from sorting and classifying students to supporting all students' learning, many evaluation practices have undergone changes to come into alignment with the newly refocused purposes of schooling.

Students are increasingly involved in communicating to others about their learning.

Involving students in communicating their learning in these ways supports learning for the following reasons:

When students communicate with others about their learning, they learn about what they have learned, what they need to learn, and what kinds of support may be available to them.

When students show evidence of learning to an audience, they receive feedback and recognition from themselves and from others. This descriptive (non-judgmental) feedback helps guide and support their learning.

The process of selecting what evidence of learning to show, who to show it to, and what kind of feedback to request, gives students an opportunity to construct their understanding and to help others make meaning of their learning. When students are offered choices, they are personally motivated.

Research indicates that when parents are involved in talking about learning with their children, they achieve more. The more parents are involved, the higher the student achievement levels.

When students communicate their learning using a variety of work samples, they go beyond what grades, numbers and scores alone can show; they are able to examine the depth, the detail, and the range of their own learning to identify their strengths and what they need to work on next. This is all part of learning to selfmonitor – an essential skill for self-directed, independent, lifelong learners.

Student-Involved conferences support learning and enhance communication with parents.

Earlier in the week you will have received information about Student, Parent/ Caregiver, Teacher Conferences that have been scheduled for Wednesday 10 October 2.00pm - 8.00pm and Thursday 11 October 2.00pm - 6.00pm and I urge you to support your child in his/her learning by participating.

Have you ever dreamt of indulging in a book, or doing a crossword on your way into town, and at the same time, assisting with the preservation of our environment?

I admit, Central Auckland's bus system does have its faults, but just by taking buses into, out and around town, you are helping yourself and the

Taking a bus will relieve the stress of driving, and you can use the spare time you have acquired on your way to your destination for many things.

I'm sure all of the parents out there would see this as a great opportunity to organize the day ahead, possibly scribble down a quick shopping list or simply have a relaxing nap or think.

If you're a student, maybe you decide to catch up with your friends, or ponder on a way to get out of the homework your teacher has set for you.

The buses leave frequently from the various bus stops, so you achieve the same freedom of going wherever you want, whenever you want that you have with a car.

Catching a bus is definitely worth it if you want to save money.

The bus fare for 1 stage is \$1.60 for adults and \$1.00 for children and senior citizens. This is less expensive than what it costs you to run your car (fuel, insurance, registration and maintenance), and consider the price of paying for parking in town, and you are saving yourself large amounts of money.

Then, when your feet are starting to ache after some serious shopping, try getting aboard an HEV bus (Hybrid Electric Vehicles), these follow a course that will take you around Auckland City at no expense whatsoever, and they are non-polluting!

There are many reasons why catching a bus will help our environment.

Air pollution causes 1,100 deaths each year in New Zealand, and motor vehicle gas emissions play a fairly large part in this.

A full bus means fifty or so fewer cars on the road, this will help thin out congestion on the roads as well as reduce air pollution.

The HEV buses that operate in town have electric engines that run on batteries. This is helping the reduction of air pollution greatly, and they are always full of people.

Buses may not be the answer to the world's air pollution problems, but for now, it's all you can do to help - apart from walking or biking that is.

This Earth is the only one we will ever get, so you better hop aboard a bus, and it will make all the difference.
