REPORT THREE

On Tuesday 16 December, the last day of term, students will be issued with REPORT THREE.

REPORT THREE reflects our emphasis in identifying what the student can do.

Pasadena Intermediate School is required to implement the New Zealand Curriculum. The Ministry prescribes that intermediate age students should be working at Level 4.

The report is intended to give parents/caregivers an indication of academic progress and effort in all curriculum areas, relating specifically to their child. Social, physical, artistic and cultural development are also regarded as worthy outcomes of the school's programme and attention is also focused on these important areas.

Please take the time to read and discuss REPORT THREE with your child.

We all know that when we have tried hard we like to have our efforts acknowledged. This acknowledgement generally encourages us to strive towards even greater efforts in the future.

HONOURS

Students receive recognition for their achievements, contributions and participation through our Special Effort Awards programme. In keeping with the school's philosophy and mission statement, we further recognise those students who participate, contribute and achieve in the full range of activities available at Pasadena through our Honours Award programme.

To qualify, students must have consistently displayed the standards as described in the Pasadena Code (Page 17 2003 Student Information Book) and receive a minimum of 10 awards as follows:

2 Technology; 2 Cultural/Arts; 2 Sport/P.E./Fitness; 2 From Classroom Teacher for class work and 2 others. The 2 others must be from different categories.

Students who believe they have qualified, apply to the Principal with their awards. If the Principal is satisfied the student has the required awards the student receives an Application Form.

The Applicant must complete a self evaluation - if the Applicant believes he or she has not consistently met any of the standards described in the Pasadena Code, the Applicant should mark the Application Form accordingly and sign.

The Application Form must be taken to each of the following -
Classroom Teacher
The Syndicate Manager
Specialist Teachers the Student is Currently Working With

If a Teacher believes the Applicant has not consistently met any of the standards described in the Pasadena Code, the Teacher will explain this to the Applicant and mark the Application Form accordingly. When the Applicant has met with all Teachers, the Application Form should be returned to the Principal.

If the Applicant's self evaluation shows and all the Teachers have been satisfied the student has consistently displayed the standards as described in the Pasadena Code, the Application is taken to the next full Staff meeting for final approval.

The student will be presented with the Honours Badge and Certificate at the next Friday Assembly.

If the Applicant's self evaluation shows or if any of the Teachers have not been satisfied with the student's performance and have marked the Application Form, the Principal will discuss the matter with the student and set a date one term hence when the student can reapply.

During their time at Pasadena, students may qualify for and receive more than 1 Honours Award.

For significant or repeated breaches of the Pasadena Code, a student may have their Honours Status removed. A student who has had Honours Status removed is entitled to earn 10 new awards and reapply.

SWIMMING POOL

UNIFORM BANK

Uniforms have been part of the intermediate scene for over 70 years. There has been, and probably always will be, debate about the merits of wearing school uniforms. Of late, the issue of safety, schools being able to identify non students in their grounds, has become a consideration.

As fashions and fabrics change, so too have the styles of school uniforms. In the early 1990s, and again in 2001, the school spent considerable time consulting with parents/caregivers and students while considering uniform changes.

There are times when students are unable to present themselves in full and correct uniform – accident, weather etc.

As we did in 2003, in 2004 to assist those students who have problems with their uniform, we propose to keep a 'bank' of spare uniform items and are asking the parents/caregivers of our leaving Year 8 students, to donate any or all of the following uniform items.

Shorts, Culottes, Shirt, Sweat Shirt, PE Shirt, PE Shorts, Caps/Hats

It would assist us if these items were in a good state of repair and have been laundered.

If you agree to your child's uniform being donated to our Uniform Bank, they are to collect a 'Consent Letter' from the Office, and we ask you to complete the form at the bottom of the letter and return it to school as soon as possible.

Donated items are to be brought to school in a plastic bag on the last day of the school year, Tuesday 16 December.

Naturally, if you are donating a uniform, your son or daughter may wear mufti on the last day.
