The School Social, organised and run by the School Council in the Pasadena Centre last week, was an outstanding success.

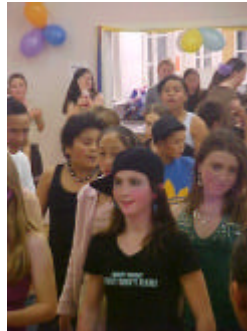
The students' dress and behaviour during the two hours supported the view of many - that the students at Pasadena Intermediate School have very well developed social skills.

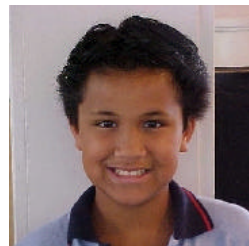


LOST PROPERTY
