Social, physical, artistic and cultural development are also regarded as worthy outcomes of the school's programme and attention is also focused on these important areas.

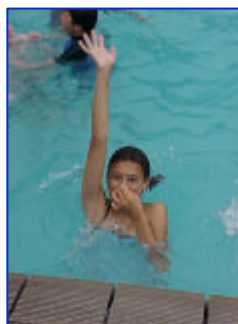
Please take the time to read and discuss REPORT FOUR and the assessments and comments.
